Products Liability and Business Litigation

- Represented a product manufacturer in a products liability case involving alleged damages exceeding \$5,000,000. After leading targeted fact and expert discovery and representing the client at mediation, the matter was resolved on favorable terms.
- Drafted and successfully argued an Anti-SLAPP motion for an insurance company, resulting in dismissal of the claims against the client and an award of attorney's fees.

- Defend retail clients and food and bedding manufacturers in litigation involving claims of violations of Proposition 65.

Consumer Protection

- Successfully represented a nutritional supplement company sued for false advertising in California. After performing a detailed preliminary investigation, and conducting discovery, we secured a favorable resolution at the Early Neutral Evaluation conference.
- Defeated a putative class action against a fitness, health and cosmetics company by negotiating a favorable settlement with the named plaintiff.
- Defeated a motion for class certification in a putative class action filed in California state court against our client, a major food manufacturer, alleging that the packaging for a specific type of dog treat misrepresented that the product was “wholesome.” The plaintiffs sought approximately \$8.4 million on behalf of the putative class, plus punitive damages and attorneys' fees under California's consumer protection statutes. We defeated class certification, and plaintiffs agreed to drop all claims.
- Currently defending a supplement company in California coordinated proceeding involving allegations of serious bodily injury and death.
