Mark says, "He's Bernie Sanders, and he has taken this thing way farther than he ever believed he could, and all credit to him for doing so but he's running out of runway here. The plane's just not going to take off." As the 2016 primary season comes to its end, Mark notes that, "It's legacy time for Bernie. He has the opportunity to write his own history. He gets to decide how he's going to be remembered. He can continue to damage Secretary Clinton and her candidacy, and he can take that right through to the convention. He can be remembered as the man who gave America President Trump. I don't think that's the legacy he's looking for right now, but that's where he's headed."
