

# D.C.'s Office of Planning asked for Comprehensive Plan comments. It got 3,000.

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Meridith Moldenhauer, a member of Cozen O'Connor's Zoning, Land Use & Development Practice, discusses the increase in proposed Comprehensive Plan amendments that Washington, D.C.'s Office of Planning received during an open call process to seek feedback from residents in *Washington Business Journal*. When the Comprehensive Plan, which addresses land use, economic development, housing, historic preservation, and transportation, received some minor revisions in 2009, the Office of Planning had received 200 proposed amendments; in 2017, the Office of Planning received approximately 3,000. Meridith explains that "there's obviously an increase in population, and people are more involved in providing insight. It's good for the process – if it doesn't slow it down."
